David Hume from Matamata spoke to us for the Rotary Foundation representing Endowments, Major Giving and PHF (Paul Harris Fellow).

The Rotary Foundation as the \$\$ source for Doing Good in the World holds a 4- star rating(highest possible); top 10 world -wide charities for at least 14 years.

David gave us examples from Sao Paulo neonatal Health Care, Clean water for 10,000 people in Peru, Education support and training in Kenya and Mental Health and Wellness for thousands of young people in Northland, New Zealand. These being just a taster of the myriad projects achieved and underway.

The \$\$s to achieve this come from Rotary members and David outlined how individual donations can be made.

EREY Every Rotarian every Year Imagine if \$1.3 million Rotarians donated \$100 =\$130 million per annum.

Centurian \$100NZ per annum =slightly less than \$2.00 per week

RFSM Rotary Foundation Sustaining Member \$US 100 equals \$ NZ170 (\$3.50 per week)

PHF <u>Paul Harris Fellow</u> \$US1000 Additional lead to Ruby, and Sapphire. Individual giving adds up. Clubs often award to members or community recipients

IAN GRANT FROM Cambridge looks after the 3 areas above.

PHS Paul Harris Society Rotarians who commit to \$US1000 per year

Major Donor Once \$10,000 donated, can be cumulative

Arch Klumph Society Donors of \$US 250,000. NZ currently has 2 such donors.

Benefactor If you include Rotary Foundation Endowment Fund as beneficiary of \$1000 or donate directly

Beguest Society Best to seek legal advice for this Minimum \$US 10,000

Named Funds in form of an Endowment Invested in perpetuity. Raises \$1000 back to your district every year forever.
